MP State women hockey academy: growing and glittering

Madhya Pradesh State Government has been running **two hockey academies**, for boys at Bhopal and girls at Gwalior. About 40 girls get high performance training on professional basis. Some girls from the Gwalior Academy have already made it to the national team. Youth Welfare and Sports Department of the State also came forward to host the **Junior Women's National Championship at Gwalior in Sept.** The State is also developing hi-tech Sports Centres where, like in Gwalior, **synthetic turf** will also be laid for hockey besides boarding and lodging facilities for the Academy's wards.
